The Economic Basis.* The Symposium will be held in Biskupin, Żnin district on May, 23-25/26, 2007. The Honorary Patron of the Symposium is Mr Piotr Całbecki, Marshal of the Self-government of the Cuyavia-Pomerania Vbivodship. The conference will be held in English. Costs of stay in Biskupin for authors of papers will be paid by the Archaeological Museum in

Biskupin. We suggest appearing on May 22 (Tuesday) afternoon and leaving Biskupin on May 26 (Saturday).

The best way to travel to Biskupin is from Poznań or Bydgoszcz by bus to Gąsawa, and from Gąsawa to Biskupin by Biskupin Museum car (please let us know in advance). You have the following options if you want to reach Biskupin by car: from Gniezno by E261 road (trunk road 5) to the north of Rogowo and then by a local road to Gąsawa and Biskupin, or from Żnin by E261 road (trunk road 5) to the south of Bożejewice and then from Bożejewice by local road to Biskupin (see also information on Biskupin Museum website — www.biskupin.pl).
